Always pre-wet with sterile and non-pyrogenic saline before use.

Fill the inner packaging blister with physiological saline solution until the block is fully covered. Soak for 5–10 minutes, until it becomes soft and pliable.

Hydrating time can be reduced to 3 minutes by gently pressing and releasing the product from time to time (at least 2 times in 30 seconds).

Rinse surgical gloves to remove any powder and leachable additives prior to handling Orthoss® Collagen.



Remove excess saline

Squeeze the block to remove excess saline before you add blood, bone marrow aspirate and/or bone.



Shape the block

Following hydration with sterile, non-pyrogenic saline solution the product becomes soft and pliable and can be cut or shaped to fit the defect site.



Add blood and/or bone marrow

Once the block is fully hydrated with physiological saline solution, it can be saturated with blood or bone marrow aspirate and/or be mixed with autologous bone.

Place carefully into a well vascularized and confined bone defect.

Ensure maximal contact between product and bone wall. Avoid compaction and do not overfill. Secure product in the bone defect to avoid migration.



Do not use more than 3 blocks of o.8 cc Orthoss[®] Collagen in one defect.
